## THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

### FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

# 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

- Riders have until **7pm** on Friday to declare their classes for day 2, except horses nominated for the Grand prix cannot be changed.

### HALA FEBRUARY CHAMPIONSHIP GRAND PRIX RULES

- This championship comprises one competition and a final, each taking place on a different day. The first competition is conducted over a big table A course and judged under table C(JRs Art.239 and 263).
- The starting order of the first competition is drawn in the presence of the ground jury by computer. The score for this competition will be determined as follow: each athlete's time will be multiplied by the coefficient 0.50 and converted into points. The point must be rounded to two decimal places. The second decimal place will be rounded up from 0.005 and rounded down from 0.004. The athlete with the lowest number of points after this conversation will be given zero Penalties, The other Athlete being credited with the number of Penalties representing the difference in points between each of them and the leading athlete. If an athlete is eliminated or does not compete his round for any reason, he will be penalized with 20 Penalties more than the last placed Athlete who completed the Competition. Adding the 20 penalties is done after each Athlete's time has been converted into Penalties.

The final competition /Day 2 will be over two rounds(Art.273.2.1.3.3.2). The starting order for round A will be in the reverse order of the result of day one. The winner of the championship will be combination with the minimum Penalties over the two days, and with fastest time in round B(day 2).

• For the championship /Grand Prix ,one horse per athlete are allowed. Which must be declared with the entries.
