## IV. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.



#### **GENERAL RULES:**

- No changes for startlists will be made later than one (1) hour before the class in question.
- Horses may compete in two (2) different classes per day. However, in classes 115 cm and below, horses may compete twice per day in the same class with a different rider with exception to jump-off classes.
- Horses competing in classes 2-3 may as well compete third (3) time in Class No. 1 - 50 cm.
- <u>120cm</u> and above riders, who are older than <u>18 years</u> old are not allowed to compete in classes No. 1 3.
- If an entry conflicts the registration rules, then the rider/horse will automatically be removed from the lower class without notice.
- NO REFUNDS

### **Rules for Best Rider Ranking**

- Riders can collect points in Small, Medium, Big, Bronze, Silver or Gold Tour classes through the Ramadan Tour.
- If the rider has 2 or more horses in the same class, only 1 best result counts.
- The points from Week 1 competitions will be added with points from Week 2 competitions to identify the best riders.
- Riders who are eliminated, retired or disqualified don't get any points.
- The points are assigned in the following order:
   1<sup>st</sup> place gets number of participants in the class + 1 point
   2<sup>nd</sup> place gets number of participants in the class 1 point

3<sup>rd</sup> place gets number of participants in the class – 2 points and etc.

For example, there were 40 participants in the class:

1<sup>st</sup> place - 41 points

2<sup>nd</sup> place - 39 points

3<sup>rd</sup> place – 38 points

4th place - 37 point and etc.




