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IV. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

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VII. ENTRIES

IMPORTANT

- Sponsored Show rules apply to this event.
- An ambulance should be present during the show, but in the case that there isn't one the OC is responsible for providing a paramedic.
- Optimum time class rules:
 - "Nearest to optimum time above and below." The rider closest to the optimum time either above or below without any dropped obstacles is the winner of the competition.
 - There is a 3 second time frame above and below this optimum time for the rider not to carry any time faults.
 - ex: time allowed is 60 seconds, closest time to 60 seconds will win the class. There will be an open window +-3 seconds which means between 57.00 and 63.00 seconds, if the rider finishes the round before 57.00 and after 63.00 seconds, they'll get a time fault for every 4 seconds. So, the rider must finish between 57.00 and 63.00 seconds to get a clear round.
 - 4 faults for the first disobedience or obstacle knocked down and the second disobedience will count as an elimination.
